#### TO SHINE AS THE STARS FOR EVER AND EVER

Each time I step into the Oakland Scottish Rite temple, I find myself looking at it in wonder and muse that I was similary moved when I first entered the building twenty-eight years ago. When I was a child, my mother lived on Madison Street, and I was only slightly familiar with the front of the building since we rarely drove on Lakeside. On those occasions, the façade was usually lit and was a striking sight with the (then) mysterious symbols dramatically visible in the dance of light and shadow. I would stare wide-eyed from the car's back seat, with only an inkling of what went on in the building.

It wasn't until I was twenty-five that I finally saw the interior during a joint reunion between Oakland and San Francisco Bodies. I was floored.... This is what I had always wanted to see in a Masonic building! Its beauty, arguably unmatched in California, was elegant yet restrained; everything had its place. The temple does not try to impress; it does so effortlessly, exuding a power that intrigues yet perplexes. Its design and symmetry delights to such a degree that they almost demand a careful examination of the bulding's cultural and artistic influences


Most who have walked its halls are clearly impressed. I'm always pleased to hear brethren echo my sentiment that it is what they expected a Masonic builing to look like! Indeed, the temple exemplifies the potent power of Freemasonry and is a beautiful example the golden age of fraternalism. With the potent local history that is experienced by simply walking through the doors, we can continue our legacy as a beacon of Wisdom, Strength, and Beauty if we are willing to commit to recognizing that we, the members, are a part of the building. In other words, it is an extension or enhancement of our Scottish Rite lessons. It helps us to enunciate the mysteries and to give contour to our identity. While we could meet elsewhere in a less complicated and austere environment, why would we? When we speak of Freemasonry's appeal, we mention its beauties. ## From the Harry G. Yetter Masonic Research Library & Museum

Highlighting the Historical Treasures of the Oakland Scottish Rite Temple Adam Kendall, 32° KCCH, Executive Director, Oakland Scottish Rite Historical Foundation



#### FINDING THAT WHICH WAS LOST

While working in the archive, I came across a curious book titled, *History* [of the] *Masonic Home, 1850–1902*, compiled by Charles Lewis Patton, PGM (1864–1923). Intrigued, I paged through it and discovered that it was more a scrapbook compilation than a printed affair. Nevertheless, the book is a fascinating chronicle of the plans to build the Masonic home at Decoto (now Union City) by a trustee of the Masonic Home (appointed in 1895). Essentially, its a collection of pages from the California Grand Lodge proceedings, materials and accounting lists, columns culled from Masonic magazines and newspapers, along with annotations, lists of trustees and committees, and an index by Patton, are glued or inked onto the pages.

One may wonder why such a compilation is so important, especially when the information can presumably be located in the Proceedings. This is true, but most will not savor leafing through those several volumes—especially if they do not realize that the plan to build the California Masonic Homes began at the inception of the jurisdiction (1850), until it opened in 1898. Having the entire process laid out in an indexed volume, along with clippings from popular Masonic magazines, brings everything into focus. Additionally, the collection was compiled by an individual who was intimately involved, first as a trustee in 1895 and later as the Grand Master of Masons in California in 1899.

Documents such as these are a valuable resources for historians as they pull together published primary sources and additional perspectives and sources that may have otherwise gone unnoticed or forgotten.

In 1857 the committee, of which Bro. N Greene Curtis was chairman, asked tha the committee be granted further time which was so ordered.


In 1858 Bro. H. H. Hartly was ap pointed chairman of the Committee of Construction, the Winn land to be used for the education and care of orphans.

## OAKLAND VALLEY EDUCATION PROGRAM

V. Thomas Langford, 32°, Director of Education

#### THE DEGREE REVIEW PROGRAM

We spent the spring quarter reviewing the degrees in the Council of Kadosh dedicated to the Ancient Mystery Tradition. In these philosophical degrees, we examined theological questions associated with the religious mystery traditions and undertook a more in-depth evaluation of the system of moral philosophy known as virtue ethics.

In May, we will cover the fourth and final degree dedicated to the ancient mystery traditions: the 26th degree, Prince of Mercy or Scottish Trinitarian. The setting is the catacombs beneath the imperial city of Rome, and the vehicle of instruction is early Christianity and the three grades of its initiatic mysteries.

In June, the Capstone Guild will hold its quarterly meeting. We will review the 27th degree, Knight of the Sun, or Prince Adept in July. This unique degree focuses on medieval-era mystery traditions and the influence of the Renaissance. However, there is no definite historical setting, for we are in the realm of the eternal. The mythic figures of Father Adam and Father Truth summarize the lessons learned from past degrees and introduce us to the symbolism of alchemy, astrology, and numerology. Seven angels exemplify various forms of symbolic instruction in the manner of oracles.

In August, we begin our review of the chivalric tradition, starting with the 28th degree, Knight Commander of the Temple. This degree provides instruction in knightly virtues. Set during the middle ages, we follow a young squire named Constans performing his chapel vigil—the last step prior to investiture as a Teutonic Knight. This dramatic degree depicts the temptations that challenge a man on a quest for truth and honor. It gives us deep insight into one of the noblest conceptions of the human spirit.

The Degree review program meets in person after our stated meeting at 8:10 PM.

#### THE CAPSTONE GUILD

The Capstone Guild will hold its fourth quarterly meeting on June 5 to discuss the 4th degree, Secret Master. This degree is the first in the Lodge of Perfection and continues the Hiramic legend and is an introduction to the Scottish Rite system. Specifically, he is introduced to the Kabbalah as a philosophical system as we contemplate the nature of Deity. The Guild will also select the summer quarter study topic from the Chapter of Rose Croix at this meeting.

The Capstone Guild is intended to be an in-depth examination of one of the higher degrees. As a group member, you study and compare the 1783 Franken Manuscript, the *Magnum Opus* of Albert Pike, and the reunion degree script used by the Oakland degree teams.

Please remember to return any signed-out degree scripts. These should not be duplicated and will be returned to me after the meeting covering that degree.

I am keeping track of attendance at the Guild meetings because after attending a certain number of sessions, a special jewel will be presented to qualifying members of the Capstone Guild.

While the Guild is a serious attempt to understand the degree's history, purpose, and symbolism, you do not have to be a group member to attend the meetings. Everyone is invited to participate in the review discussion even if they have not formally signed up.

#### OAKLAND SCOTTISH RITE HOSTS AUTHOR CHRISTOPHER McINTOSH






