No profession of an opinion not his own, for expediency's sake of profit, or through fear of the world's disfavor; no slander of even an enemy; no coloring or perversion of the sayings or acts of other men; in insincere speech and argument for any purpose, or under any pretext, must soil his fair escutcheon [coat of arms]. Out of the Chapter, as well as in it, he must speak the Truth, and all the Truth, no more and no less; or else speak not at all (p. 579).

Keeping in mind these wise words, we should consider that our performance of this degree and the others are not just a duty, but a great honor! This conferral will illustrate how our Valley is on the upswing, utilizing the great talents that have gathered under our roof. Please lend support to the degree team for all the hard work put into these performances. Better yet, consider joining in and be a part of our grand tradition!


and its regalia. Food and libations will be provided this evening as well.

# OAKLAND VALLEY EDUCATION PROGRAM

#### THE DEGREE REVIEW PROGRAM

The Degree review program meets in person after our monthly meeting at 8:10 PM.

We spent the summer quarter completing the degrees in the Council of Kadosh. At the July meeting, the 27th degree presented a review of symbolic instruction associated with the tradition of symbolic initiation.

With the change of the season comes a new focus in the program. The new allegory is the chivalric tradition of feudal Europe. In August, we cover the 28th degree, Knight Commander of the Temple. This degree provides instruction in the knightly virtues. Set in the middle ages, a young squire named Constans performs his chapel vigil, the last step prior to his investiture as a Teutonic Knight. This dramatic degree depicts the temptations that challenge a man on a quest for truth and honor. It gives us deep insights into one of the noblest conceptions of the human spirit.

We will review the 29th degree, the Knight of Saint Andrew, in September. The second of the chivalric degrees, this degree is organized around the Knight Templar tradition and its secret revival. We follow Knight Constans as he performs his banner vigil at the Scottish encampment of the newly formed Knights of Saint Andrew. This degree builds on the courtly virtues introduced in the 28th degree with a renewed focus on heroism. Each degree emphasizes virtues associated with the highest realizations of the human character or spirit. We view the tragic dimension of unrecognized virtue in the 28th and the rewards of recognition in the 29th. However, underlying both degrees is a more important esoteric message regarding the role of judgment.

In November, we will review the 30th degree, Knight Kadosh. The 30th degree is the aggregate of the two esoteric traditions that have been the overarching themes of the Council of Kadosh: the ancient mysteries and spiritual chivalry. Both are associated with a philosophical system that emphasizes the importance of personal integrity and character building. We have moved from the lodge's focus on the nature of Deity, the chapter's consideration of our spiritual relationship with Him, to the Council's inspired conception of our societal roles. The formal instructions of the 30th degree will prepare us for the final step to understanding the Royal Secret.

#### THE CAPSTONE GUILD

The Capstone Guild will hold its fifth quarterly meeting on October 2nd to discuss the 18th degree, the Knight of Rose Croix—the final degree in the Chapter of Rose Croix. From it, the Mason will gain invaluable symbolic instruction in the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity, which are linked with the trinity of wisdom, strength, and beauty. During the meeting, we will be taking a closer look at the sym-


bolism of the coronet, the cross, the rose, and the pelican. The Guild will also select the winter quarter study topic at the October meeting, a degree from the Council of Kadosh.

The Capstone Guild is intended to be an in-depth examination of one of the higher degrees. As a group member, you study and compare the 1783 Franken Manuscript, Albert Pike's *Magnum Opus*, and the Reunion Degree Script used by the Oakland degree teams.

I am keeping track of attendance at the Guild meetings because after attending a certain number of sessions, a special jewel will be presented to qualifying members of the Capstone Guild.

While the Guild is a serious attempt to understand the degree's history, purpose, and symbolism, you do not have to be a group member to attend the meetings. Everyone is invited to participate in the review discussion even if they have not formally signed up.



# From the Harry G. Yetter Masonic Research Library & Museum

Highlighting the Historical Treasures of the Oakland Scottish Rite Temple Adam Kendall, 33°-elect, Executive Director, Oakland Scottish Rite Historical Foundation


#### A HISTORY WITHIN A HISTORY

After several months since their discovery, we were able to recover three boxes that were stored in the basement of the Valley of Oakland's old temple on Madison Street. After the valley vacated the premises, it was still in Masonic hands (this is from information I've been able to glean from oral histories). Tucked in these records is a fascinating scrapbook dated 1928 until the late 1940s (with photographs) and other written materials belonging to Oakland Lodge, chartered by the influential Ancient and Mystical Order Rosæ Crucis (AMORC), a non-denominational philosophical and mystical fraternal order which owns Rosicrucian Park and the Egyptian Museum in San Jose, California.

First convening as a chapter in the Pacific Building in downtown Oakland, they met at an array of Oakland locations, including the Pythian Castle, the Women's Club, the Baha'i Rooms, and even in their own homes (the latter was sternly rebuked in a letter by their grand lodge, which was also included in the collection).


In 1934, they began meeting at the Madison St. Scottish Rite Temple. In 1934, they began meeting at the Madison St. Scottish Rite Temple. How long they met at this location is unclear, but the documents' cold storage indicates that it was, perhaps, for several years as the group grew from chapter to lodge. The records' presence *might* also suggest that some of our Scottish Rite members belonged, and the documents were stored in the temple for safekeeping. During the early 20th century, there were several Oakland Scottish Rite members who belonged to AMORC and other mystical / philosophical fraternities, such as the Theosophical Society and the Vedanta Society.

Such crossovers are fascinating for our own fraternity, as it reveals the depth and breadth of our members' interests, including the vast wisdom imparted in the curriculum of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite; it's a fascinating social network of soul-searching. These documents also feature now-closed or renovated meeting halls that once held an important place in civic life, which patronized and supported a vibrant community of philosophical and social fraternities.






