For those who do not know me, I am a product of Oakland through and through. I was born on Pill Hill at the old Samuel Merritt Hospital and grew up in East Oakland. Living in the Park Boulevard District,

I graduated from Oakland High School, the old "Pink Prison" located at MacArthur and Park Boulevards.

I have very deep Masonic roots, going back to my grandfather. In 1973 I was raised a Master Mason in Foothill Lodge No. 564 (now Island City Lodge No. 215), thus making me a third-generation California Master Mason. I served Foothill Lodge as Master in 1978. I am a member of the Oakland York Rite Bodies and have received the Knight York Cross of Honor (KYCH). I was Potentate of Aahmes Shriners in 2013. In November 2021, I was installed as the Worthy Patron of Alameda Oak Leaf Chapter 8, Order of the Eastern Star, beginning my seventh term as Worthy Patron. This December, I completed two years as Sovereign Master of Bay Cities Council, Allied Masonic Degrees.

At this, the beginning of my forty-eighth year in the Oakland Scottish Rite, I am very humbled, honored, and privileged to serve you, my brothers, as Venerable Master. I thank you for the confidence you have placed in me!

I have many fun events on my calendar, which includes a Shrine night, a Cinco de Mayo celebration, and a traditional Old Timers' Night.

Unfortunately due to the current spiking trends with COVID 19 variants, we had to reschedule the clebration of the lunar new year. But, we *will* have that new year dinner at a later date!



#### A Heritage of Wonder and Mystery


We are all familiar with the glorious array of architectural flourishes within our beloved Oakland Scottish Rite Temple. But these are not random embellishments, nor are they slavish displays of wealth. Although Masons could easily confer degrees in more austere environments, the history of Freemasonry (along with economic and social factors unique to a particular era) underscores a potent heritage of ritual spaces that deliberately evoke the classical, ancient, ages... the birthplaces of humanity's inspiration. With deliberate design, these rooms are meant to produce awe, and inspire the brethren to exist, even for an hour or two, in a liminal space where where the romantic, idealized, past eclipses the mundane present.


These spaces are memorials to the wisdom, strength, and beauty that assisted humankind with constructing wonderous works of state and religious art. Whether or not Freemasonry actually had any historical influence on these endeavors is immaterial; the Craft employs these mythological and historical periods in order to teach, learn, and socialize. Few secular organizations posess these qualities, and, as such, our temples and halls represent a valid and unique contribution to the development of civic space and the cultivation of the social and intellectual graces. We are stewards of this honorable heritage–especially here in Oakland, where we have enjoyed three offical Scottish Rite temples!

## OAKLAND VALLEY EDUCATION PROGRAM

**NOTICE:** In response to the pandemic, meeting times and format have changed for the Valley's education programs. When indicated, all classes except for the guided meditations are in person.

#### The Degree Review Program

Unless otherwise noted in my article and the OSR Bulletin calendar, the degree review program meets in person after our stated meeting at 8:00 PM.

At the March stated meeting, we will review the 16th degree, Prince of Jerusalem. The 15th and 16th degrees are the *New Temple* degrees. The narrative concerns King Solomon's Temple, which, having been destroyed by the Babylonians, is rebuilt under the leadership of Zerubbabel. These two degrees are a transition between the Hiramic legends of the Lodge of Perfection (regarding events surrounding the construction of King Solomon's temple) and the Christ principle and the New Law of Love presented in the 17th and 18th degrees. It is a transition from the Old Testament to the New Testament and is, at times, quite mystical.

Remember, these are multimedia presentations followed by a discussion— an excellent way to refresh your recollection of the degree and gain new insights. I will have the PowerPoint presentation in the Library and then move to the Members' Lounge for discussion and refreshments.

#### The Capstone Guild

The Capstone Guild is a new study group that meets quarterly and is intended to be an indepth examination of one of the higher degrees. The reading material includes the 1783 Franken Manuscript, Albert Pike's Magnum Opus, and the actual degree scripts used for our degree reunions. While no quizzes or papers are required, it is hoped that the assigned reading will foster in the group a more dynamic analysis of the degree.

At the orientation meeting on January 3, the group selected the 13th degree, the Royal Arch of Solomon, from the Lodge of Perfection as its first topic of study. At the stated meeting on March 7, 2022, I will hand out copies of the degree script to registered members of the group. These degree scripts should not, under any circumstances, be duplicated in any way, and they will be returned to me following the April meeting.

Our first quarterly meeting will be on April 11, 2022, at 8:00 PM in the Members' Lounge. Guildsmen will be sharing their thoughts regarding the evolution of the degree, the symbolism, and comparative analysis with other high degree systems. We will also be selecting a degree from the Chapter of Rose Croix for our next quarterly review.

Everyone is invited to attend the review discussion even if they have not joined the group.

Let me begin by wishing you and your family good health and an abundance of happiness for 2022. By the time you receive this publication, the Scottish Rite Valley of Oakland will have installed their officers for 2022.

For those who may not be familiar with the Knights of Saint Andrew (KSA), it was chartered as a service group throughout the Southern Jurisdiction to assist the membership in various endeavors. To that end, at the Valley of Oakland we assist at events and help maintain our building's splendor.

According to KSA legend, the Order was "...formed in 1314 by King Robert the Bruce of Scotland to honor sixty-three Templar Knights who, upon the fields of Bannockburn, and with no prior notice, charged to the rescue of a faltering Scottish army. With bravery and discipline, they quickly turned the tide of battle and defeated the superior English forces. Our modern Order was fashioned on the noble example of those sixty-three knights who came to the service of Scotland in her most dire time of need."\*

- Earl ~ Senior Deacon
- Viscount ~ Junior Deacon
- Armiger ~ Tyler

We have stated meetings and social nights on the second Friday of every month unless conflicting with a holiday or special event. As a member of the Order of the Knights of Saint Andrew, you cultivate a heightened sense of honor, virtue, value, and integrity. We have indicated a sincere wish to be of service to our brethren, their families, as well as visiting dignitaries while at the same time gaining a more profound admiration and respect for the Scottish Rite.

The Knights of Saint Andrew is open to all 32° ("black hat") Scottish Rite masons. The organization is always looking to increase its ranks to answer the call of service when it arises. You may obtain an application to join the Knights by asking any Knight, or from the General Secretary's office.
