

It bears a striking resemblance to the tomb of Mausolus at Halicarnassus. This design is a close relative of the House of the Temple in Washington DC and perhaps the St. Louis Masonic Temple. During this era, classical design was common among many US-based Scottish Rite temples.

# OAKLAND VALLEY EDUCATION PROGRAM

### THE DEGREE REVIEW PROGRAM

The degree review program spent the winter quarter focusing on the degrees in the Consistory of Masters of the Royal Secret. In December, we looked at the Consistory as a whole. In January, we presented the PowerPoint related to the 31st Degree, the Grand Inspector Inquisitor Commander, or Initiate of the Egyptian Mysteries.

To better understand spiritual justice, we saw how the degree compared human justice with that of the divine. In March, there will be a follow-up discussion concerning the judgment scene from the Egyptian Book of the Dead. We will consider the ancient Egyptians' unique perception of the soul and its role in judgment after death. Also discussed will be how the series of gates and challenges after death represents a psychological voyage in the evolution of consciousness. Please join us for this mystical journey into the mythic form of consciousness that inspired the ancient Egyptians.

In April, I am dedicating the degree review meeting to our Valley's preparation for the Orient-wide Reunion on April 26–28.

Following the April Reunion, we will restart the degree review program in May with the 4th Degree.

#### THE CAPSTONE GUILD

The Capstone Guild will hold its sixth quarterly meeting in February to discuss the 30th Degree, the Knight Kadosh. The Guild will also select the spring quarter study topic at the February meeting. This Degree will be from the Lodge of Perfection and will be discussed at July's quarterly meeting.

The Capstone Guild is intended to be an in-depth examination of one of the higher degrees. As a group member, you will study and compare the 1783 Franken Manuscript, Albert Pike's Magnum Opus, and the Reunion Degree Script used by the Oakland degree teams.

I am keeping track of attendance at the Guild meetings because after attending a certain number of sessions, a special jewel will be presented to qualifying members of the Capstone Guild.

While the Guild is a serious attempt to understand the history, purpose, and symbolism of the Degree, you do not have to be a member of the group to attend the meetings. Everyone is invited to participate in the review discussion even if they have not formally signed up.

# From the Harry G. Yetter Masonic Research Library & Museum



### TURNING THE TIDES OF HISTORY

Our Valley's library collection never ceases to amaze. It is filled with volumes of important texts collected over the years by dedicated members who placed great value on education and the preservation of documents of crucial import.

This latest discovery is a first edition pamphlet authored by the legendary political activist William Penn (1644–1718) and printed in London in 1687: The reasonableness of toleration, and the unreasonableness of penal laws and tests wherein is prov'd by Scripture, reason and antiquity, that liberty of conscience is the undoubted right of every man, and tends to the flourishing of kingdoms and commonwealths, and that persecution for meer religion is unwarrantable, unjust, and destructive to humane society, with examples of both kinds.

The London-born Penn was the founder of the Province of Pennsylvania during the British colonial era in 1681. He was a philosopher and a staunch (and controversial) advocate of freedom of religion and democracy. He is known for writings that called for the unification of the English colonies.

### STATE HISTORY THROUGH A MASONIC LENS

Below is a November 4, 1942 congratulatory letter from the Valley of Oakland's General Secretary to Earl Warren, 33°, who had recently been elected to his first term as governor of California. He was coroneted a 33rd Degree Scottish Rite Mason the previous year on December 23rd, 1941.

Warren served as Alameda County Deputy District Attorney in 1920; District Attorney from 1925 to 1932; California Attorney General from 1938 to 1943; 30th Governor of California from 1943–1953 (three terms); and Chair of the California Republican Party, 1932–1938. In 1948, Warren was Thomas Dewey's presidential running mate. In 1953, President Eisenhower appointed him Chief Justice of the US Supreme Court, a position he held until 1969.

Warren served as Grand Master of Masons in California from 1935 to 1936.



On November 9, 2023, Ill. Adam Kendall, 33°, Valley Orator and Executive Director of the Oakland Scottish Rite Historical Foundation, traveled to London, England to be installed as the 2024 Junior Warden of the world's premier lodge of research, Quatuor Coronati No. 2076.

Ill. Adam is one of six living North Americans to belong to the lodge, and is the first Californian to hold office. The late Alexander Horne (1897–1988) was the only other California Mason to be elected to full membership sixty-two years ago.






